Offices draw interest, condo tower moves ahead

Fan Pier's leasing activity picked up this spring and developer Joe Fallon ap-pears close to convincing another downtown compa-ny to make the leap across Fort Point Channel to his growing waterfront neigh-borhood.

Energy-management firm Enernoc may unplug from its 101 Federal St. offices and move into One Marina Park Drive, the first finished building in the \$3 billion Fan Pier project.

"We're in the middle of negotiating a lease," Fal-lon told the Herald, adding that his brokers are fielding interest from several prospective tenants seeking large spaces. "Before we were talking about break-ing up floors, but those fullfloor tenants have come back into the market."

In the Financial District, Enernoc leases about 60,000 square feet — the equivalent of two floors of space at One Marina Park Drive, which is about 68


